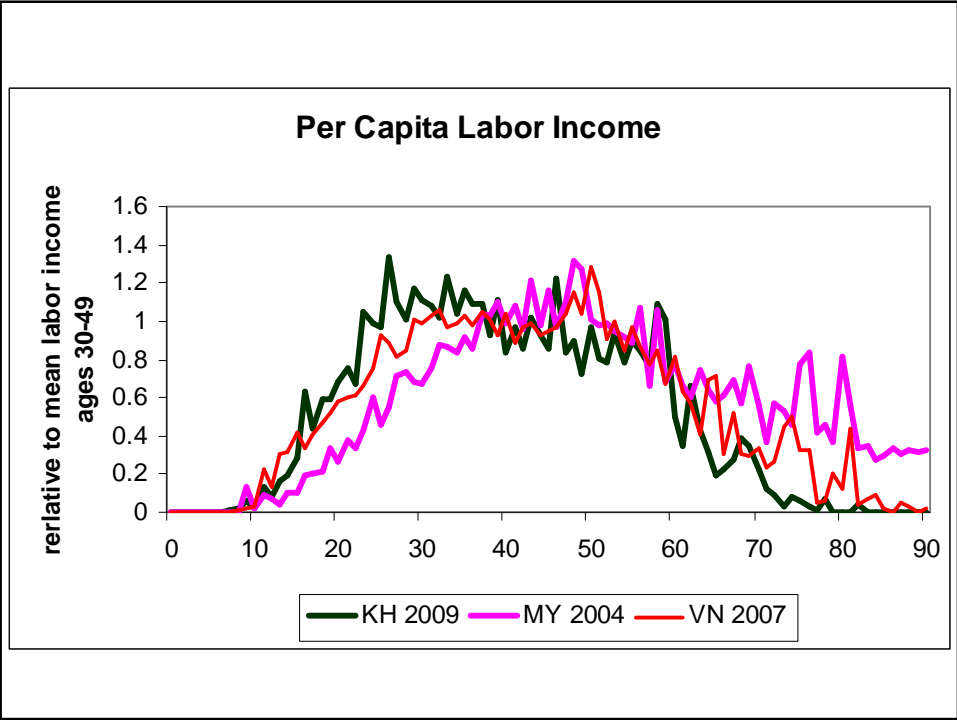
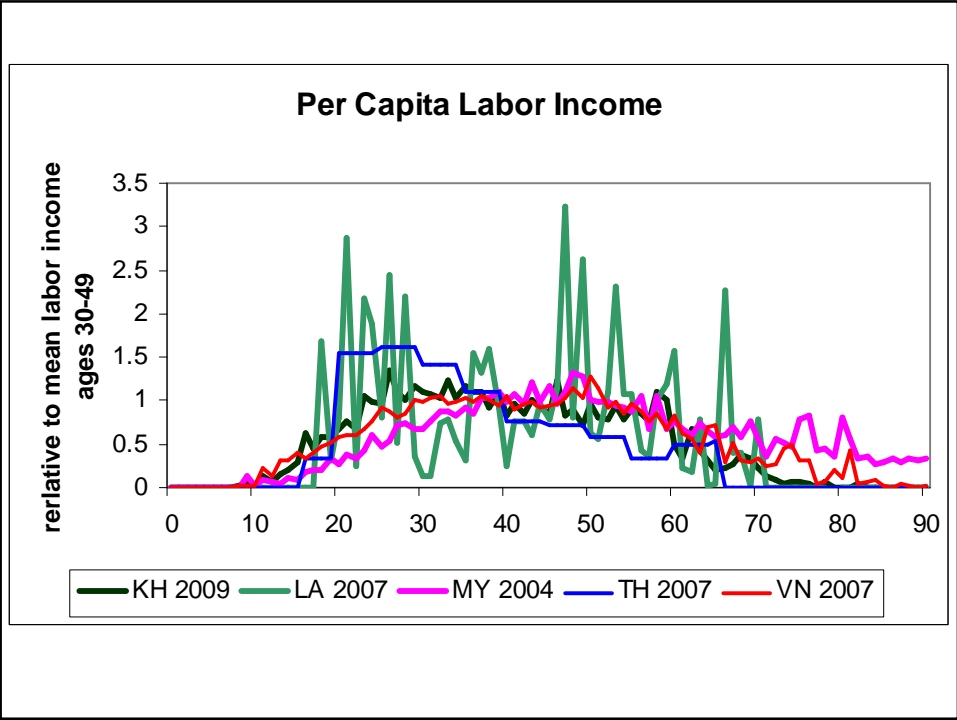
- International Comparison of the Economic Lifecycles for Laos, Cambodia, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam
- Note that results presented here are in per capital values and adjusted to national accounts. Values are normalized to mean labor income ages 30-49.

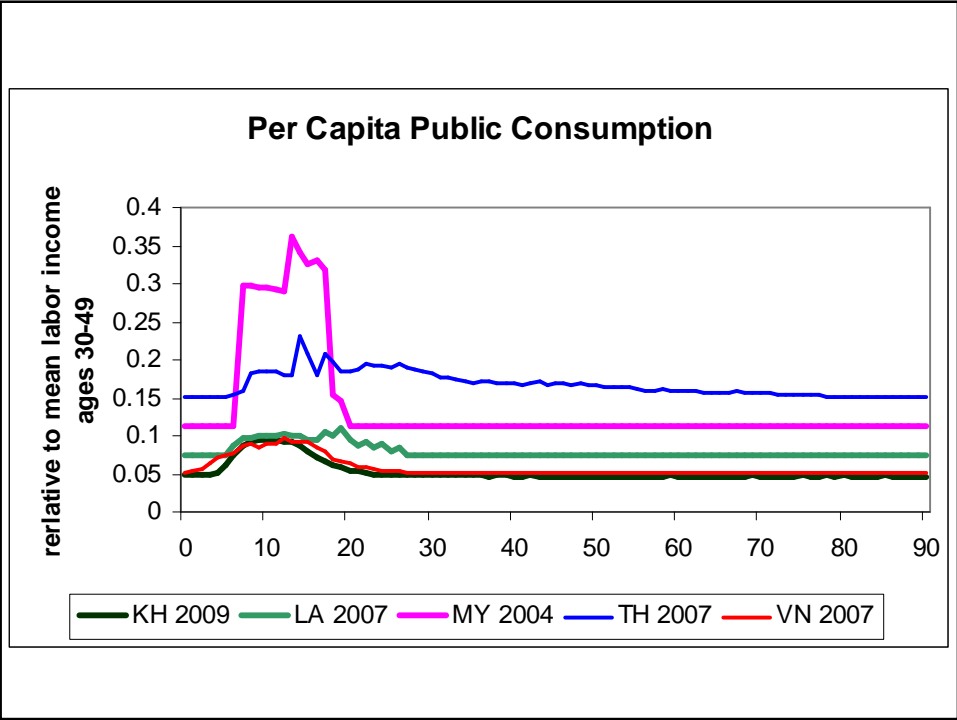
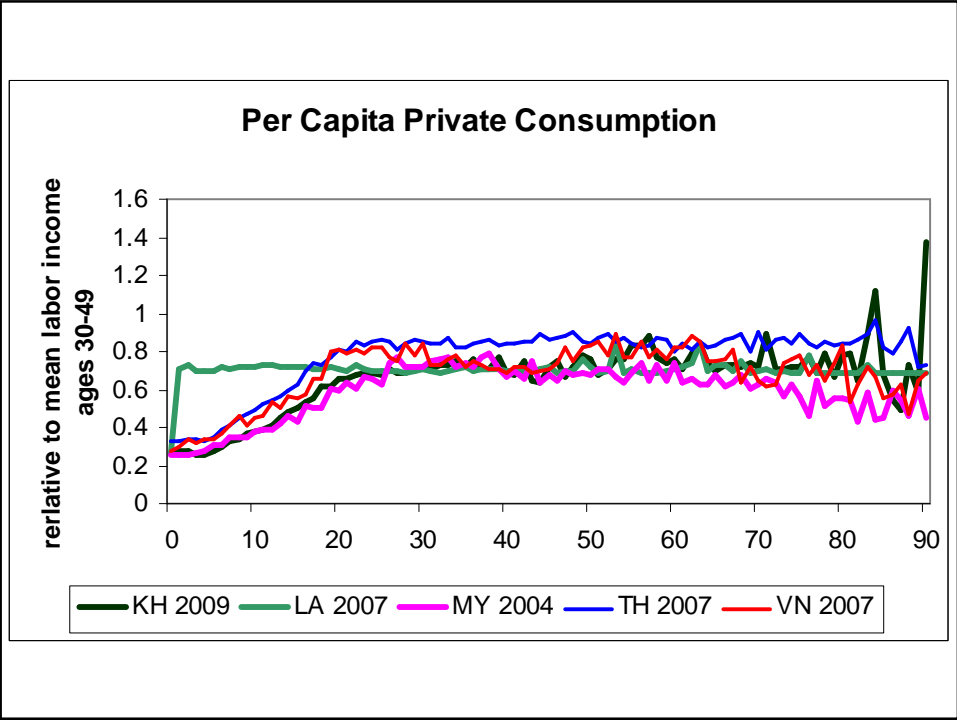
