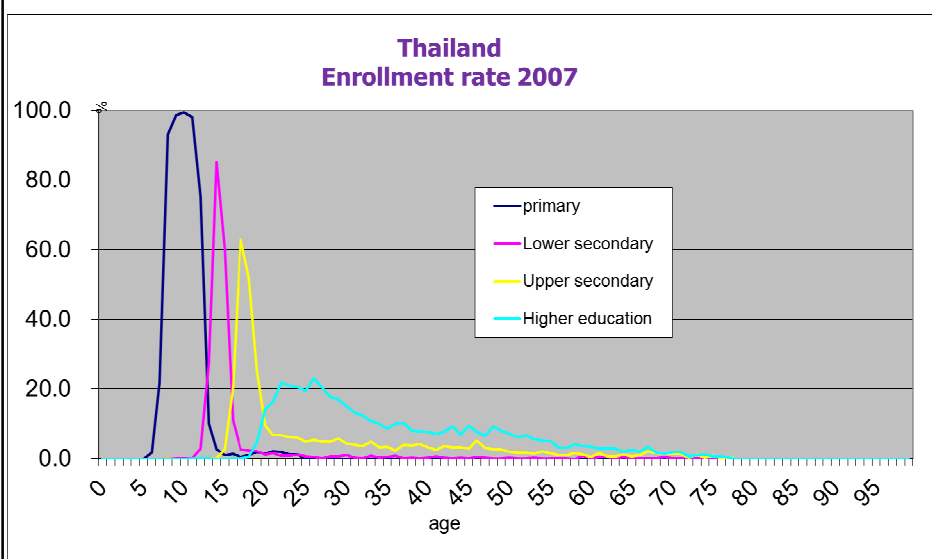

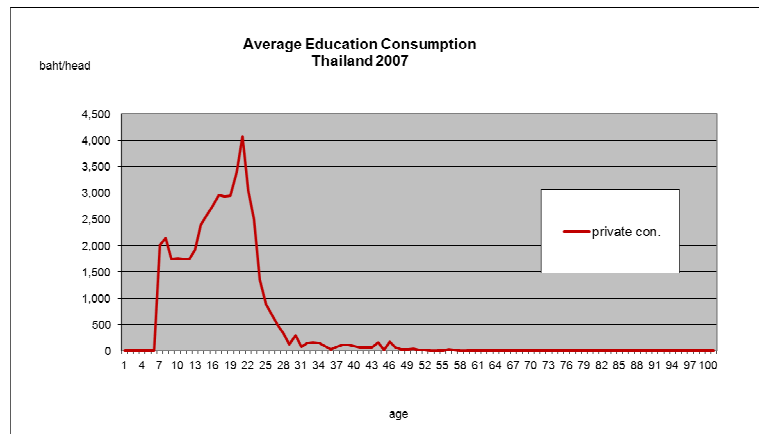

Enrollment Rate

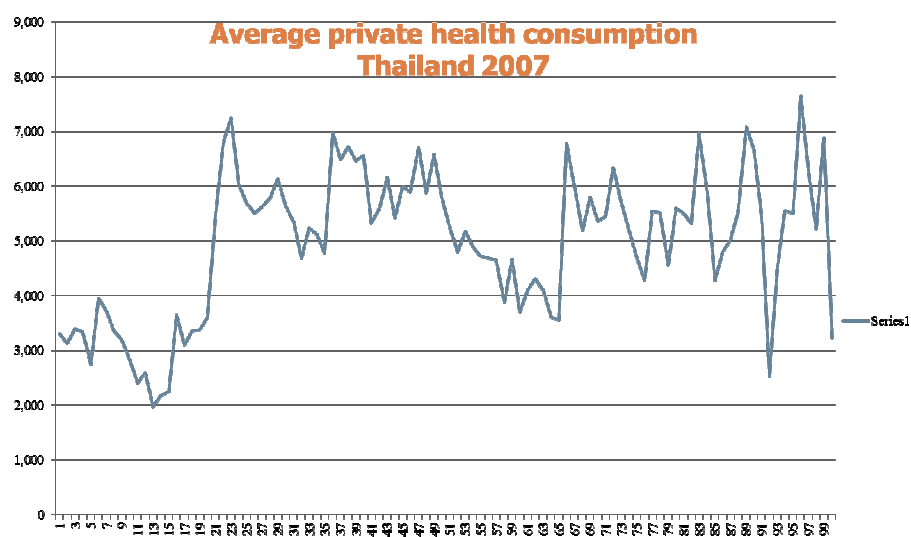
Enrollment rate of Thailand by utilizing SES in 2007



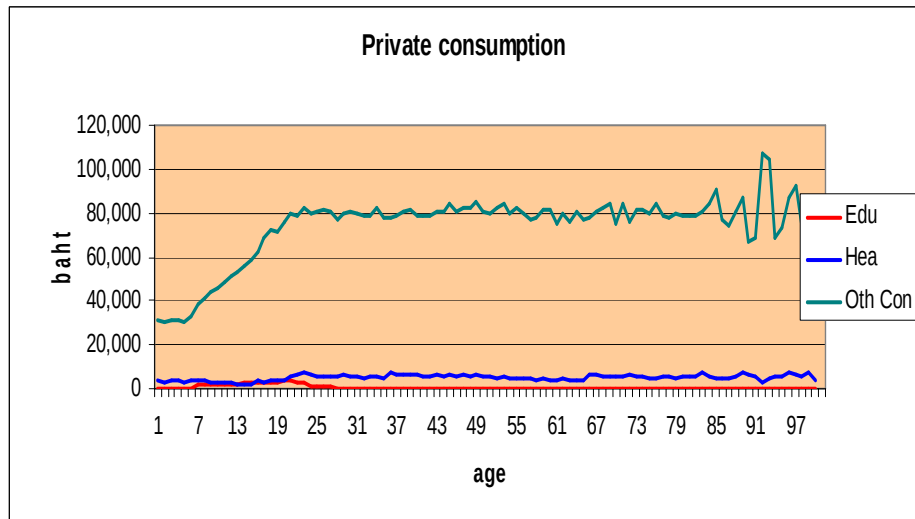

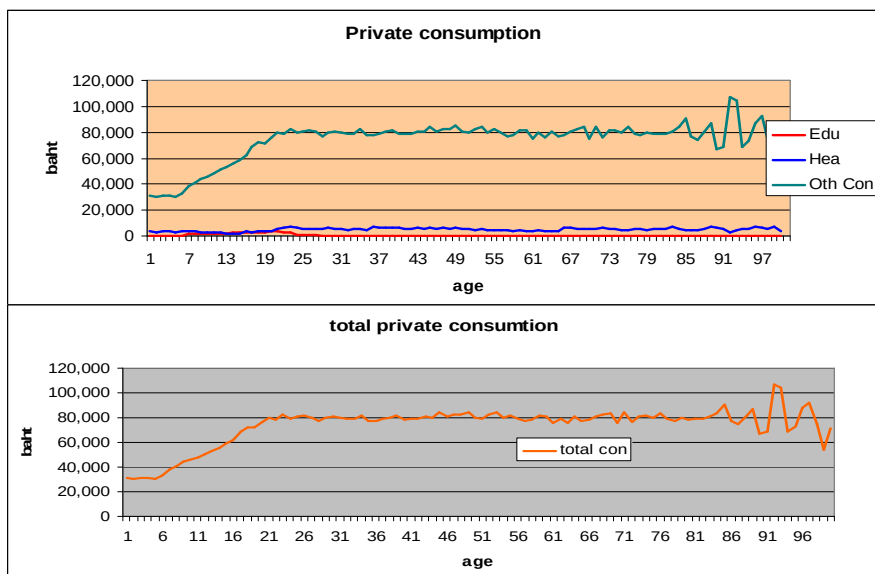

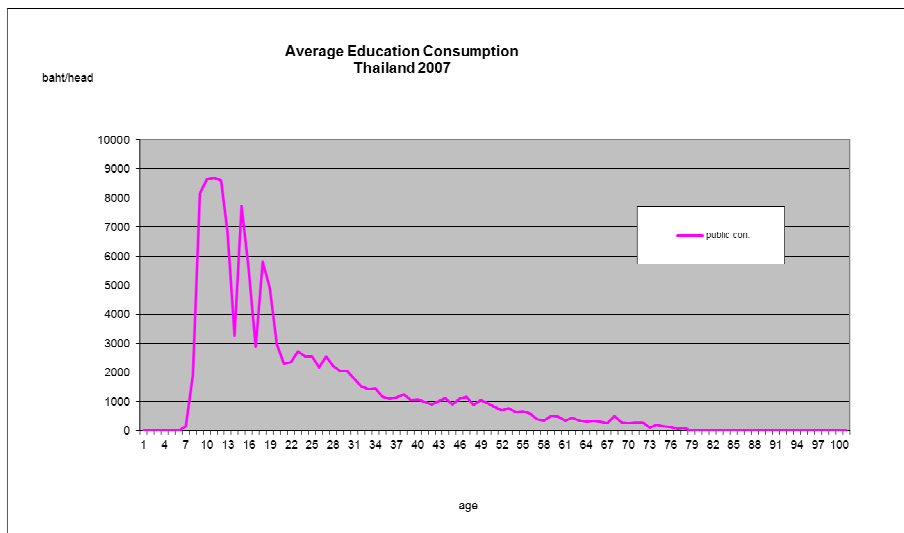

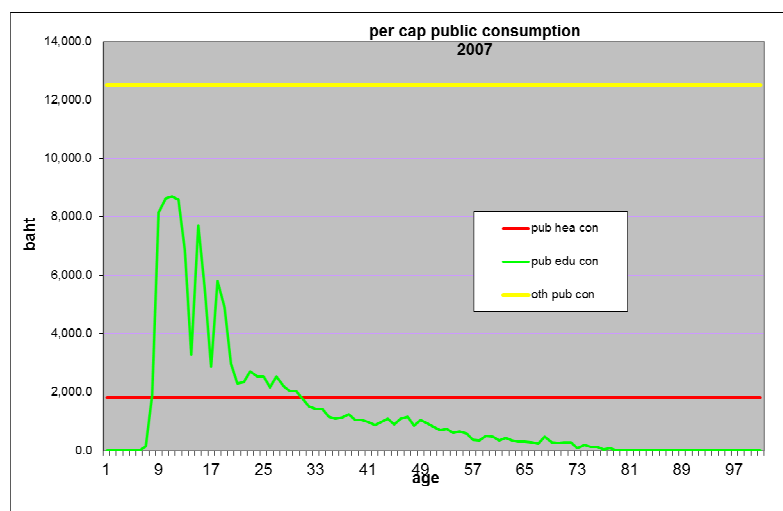

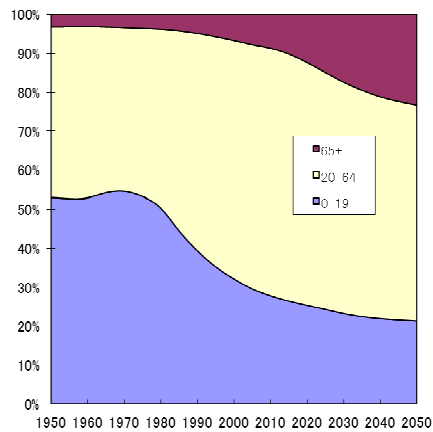

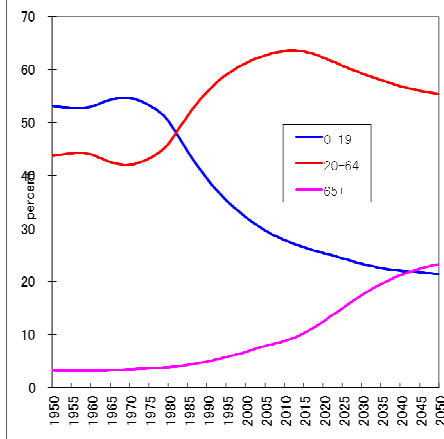

Population age structure of Thailand, 1950-2050

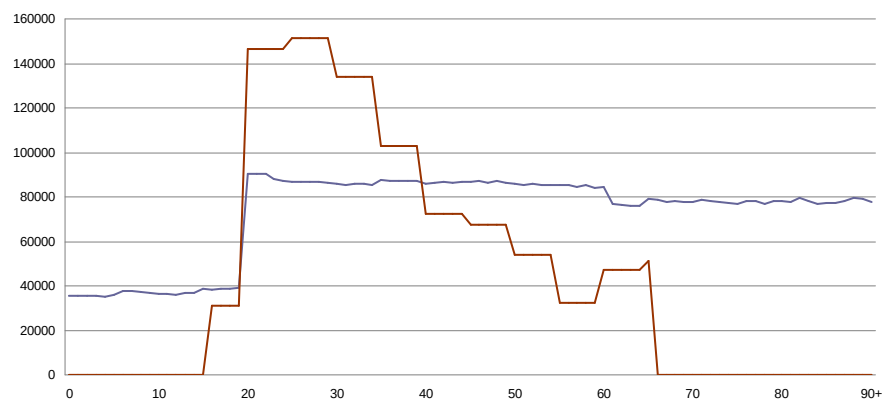


Population age structure of Thailand, 1950-2050



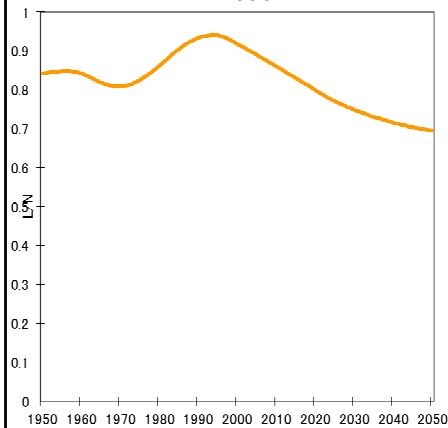
9. Age Profile

Per capita consumption and labor income Thailand 2007

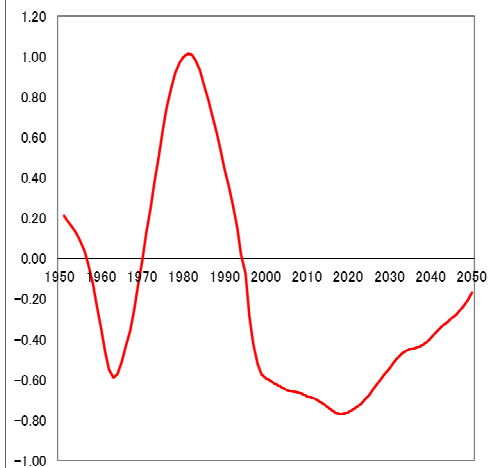
