




## Consumption and labor income: mean profiles in 2005




## LCD: mean profile in 2005



## Consumption and labor income: aggregate profiles in 2005





Monetized with minimum wage


**Consumption and labor income (incl. home goods) :  
mean profiles in 2005**








**LCD (incl. home production): mean profiles for men and women in 2005**




## Labor income: mean profiles (normalised to 1)




## Wages: mean profiles (normalised to 1)




## Self employed incomes: mean profiles (normalised to 1)




## Consumption: mean profiles (normalised to 1)




## Private consumption (excl. health and education) : mean profiles (normalised to 1)




# Global deficit

- Sum of aggregate deficits and surpluses at a given date/GDP (eq. to the support ratio)
- Global deficit of the 20-
- Global déficit of the 60+


## The global deficit as a share of GDP




## Shares of the deficits of the **60+** and the **20-** in GDP




**Shares of the deficits of the 60+ and the 20- in GDP  
divided by the number of 60+ or 20-**




**Shares of the deficits of the 60+ and the 20- in GDP

# Conclusions

Over the 26 years we considered:

- Remarkable equality across ages and cohorts of consumption
- LCDs of 60+ and 20- were constant
- Discussion of youngs/olds & men/women inequalities relies on home goods
- Next step: the « financing » of the LCD
