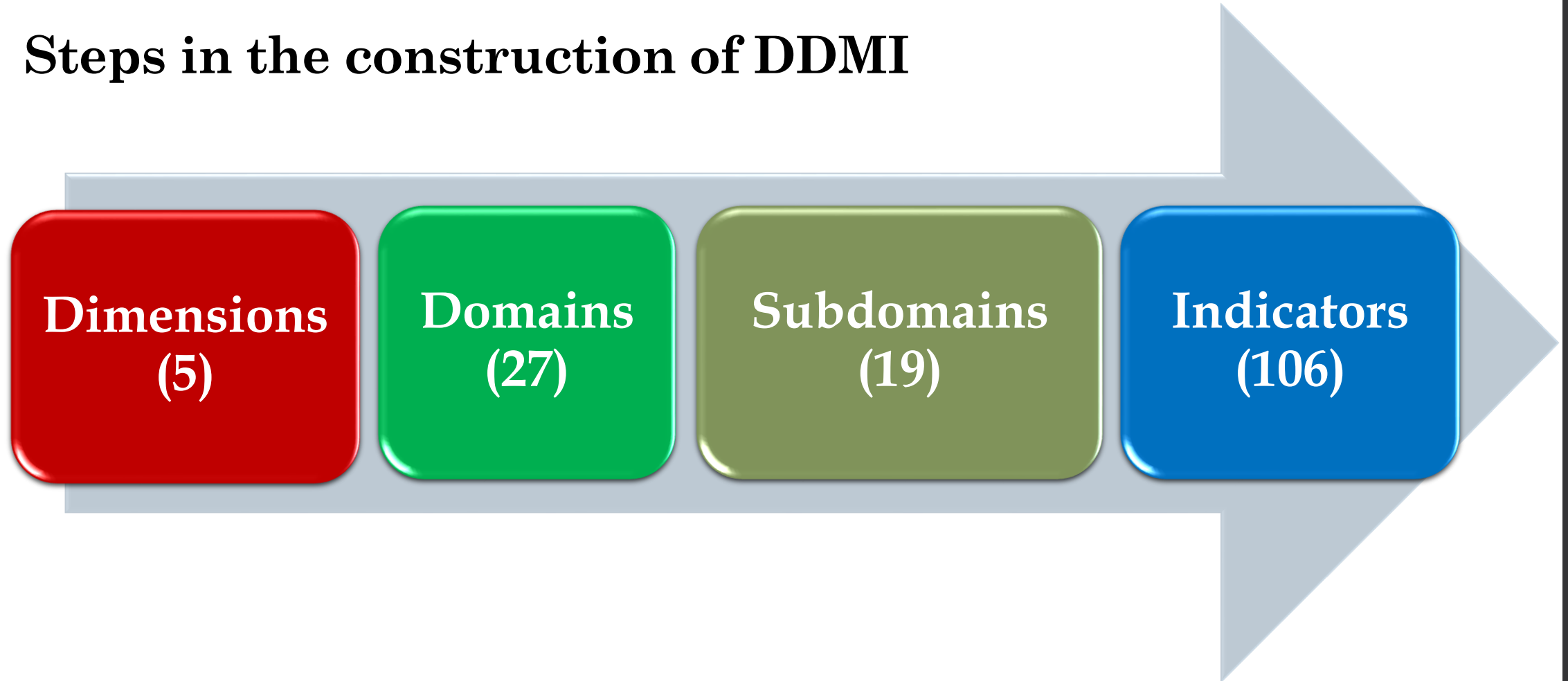

# The Weight

Dimensions, Domains, Subdomains and Indicators were selected given their:

- *relative importance in DD achievement*
- *peculiarity to the entity context*
- *closeness to the Agenda 2030 and 2063*

and assigned differential weights

# The Scores and Normalised Scores

- Each indicator has its score and a standard unit of measurement
- To remove outlier effects, indicator scores were transformed differently through:
  - original unit of measurement; or
  - available benchmarks or comparable global/national/zonal minimum and maximum scores.
- Negative scales (mortality, stunting, Out of Sch) were remeasured on the positive scale (subtracted from 1).
- Scores were normalized to a common unit by dividing it by respective units of measurement.

## Index

*(Weighted Score / Weight) \* 100*

*Index range from worst (0) to best (100)*



## Classification of the Performance of the Index

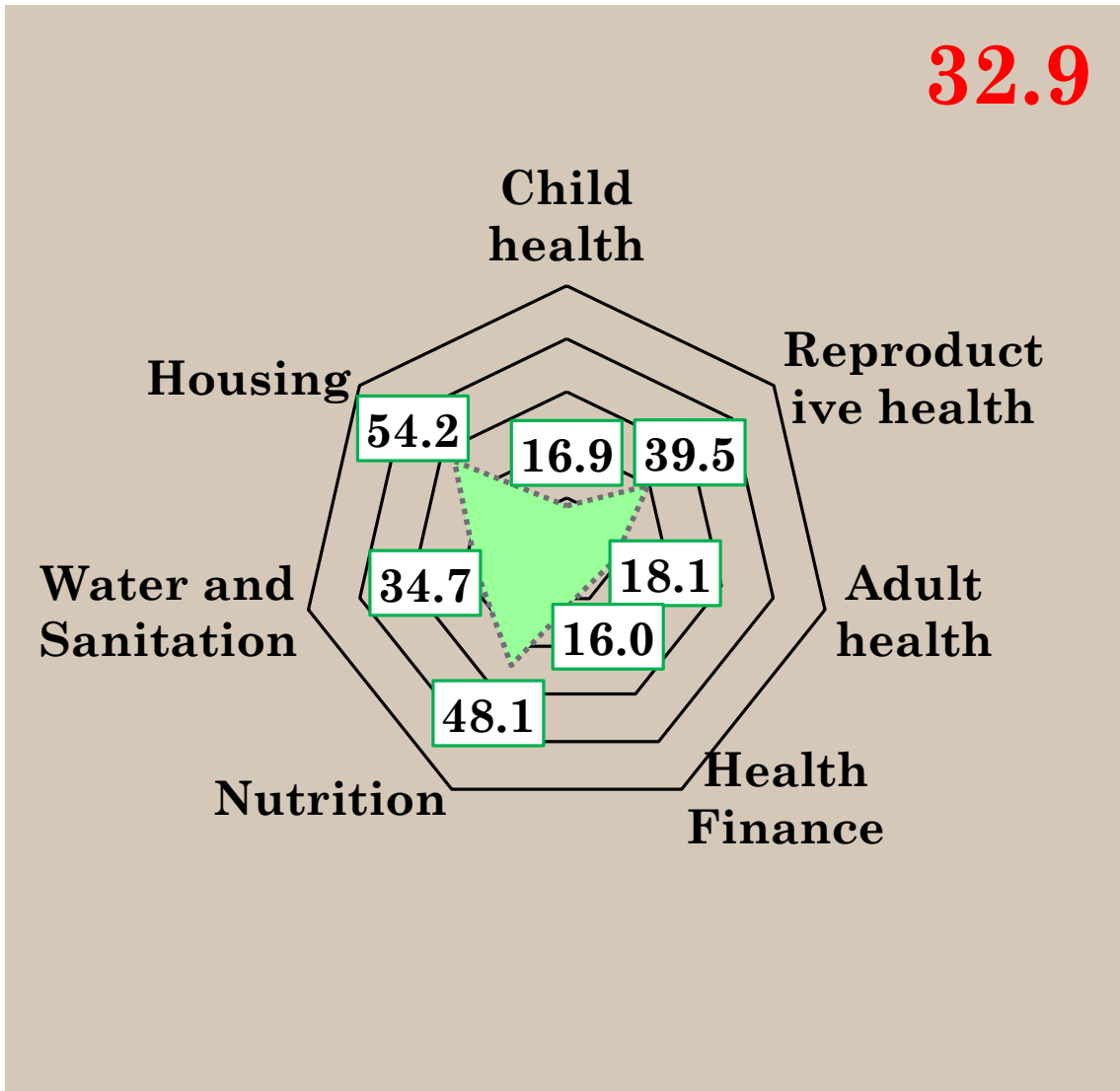
Index Score	Performance	Dashboard Colour
81 - 100	Optimal progress	
61 - 80	Good progress	
41 - 60	Average progress (intervention needs to be scaled up)	
21 - 40	Deficient (Intervention required)	
0 - 20	Critically Deficient (Serious Intervention required)	

# Data and Sources

- Domestic (national surveys and reports) and international databases for 2016.
- Sources are publicly available and easily accessible (DHS, Digest of Education Statistics, WASH-NORM – NBS, CBN, Worldbank, etc)
- Selected indicators were validated within the National Transfer Accounts Global Network.

# The Steering Committee:

- Provide overall coordination of activities
- Meets biannually to review implementation status and re-strategise on the advice of the technical committee
- Membership include:
  - ❖ Vice President – Chair
  - ❖ Minister of Budget and National Planning – Deputy Chair
  - ❖ Chairman, National Population Commission
  - ❖ Senior Special Assistant to the President on SDGs (SSAP-SDG)
  - ❖ Minister of direct DD-related MDAs (Health, Education, Labour and Employment, Justice, Youth and Sport, Agriculture and Rural Development, Women Affairs and Social Development, Information and Culture; Communication; Trade and Investments; etc)
  - ❖ Statistician-General
  - ❖ UNFPA Representative

## The Technical Committee (Implementation):

- Develop the detailed implementation plan containing activities, timeline for delivery and financing strategy
- Meets quarterly to document progress report of the planned activities.
- Reports to the Steering Committee
- Membership include:
  - ❖ Director General, National Population Commission – Chair
  - ❖ Permanent Secretary, Budget and National Planning – Deputy Chair
  - ❖ Desk Officers of direct DD-related MDAs
  - ❖ HPTRP Representatives

## The Technical Committee (M & E):

- Monitor the signature indicators for tracking progress in the implementation of the DD activities
- Coordinate and report on progress in the implementation of the DD activities using the timeline targets set by Implementation Committee
- Reports to the Steering Committee
- Membership include:
  - ❖ Permanent Secretary, Budget and National Planning – Chair
  - ❖ Director General, National Population Commission – Deputy Chair
  - ❖ M & E Desk Officers of direct DD-related MDAs
  - ❖ HPTRP Representatives
